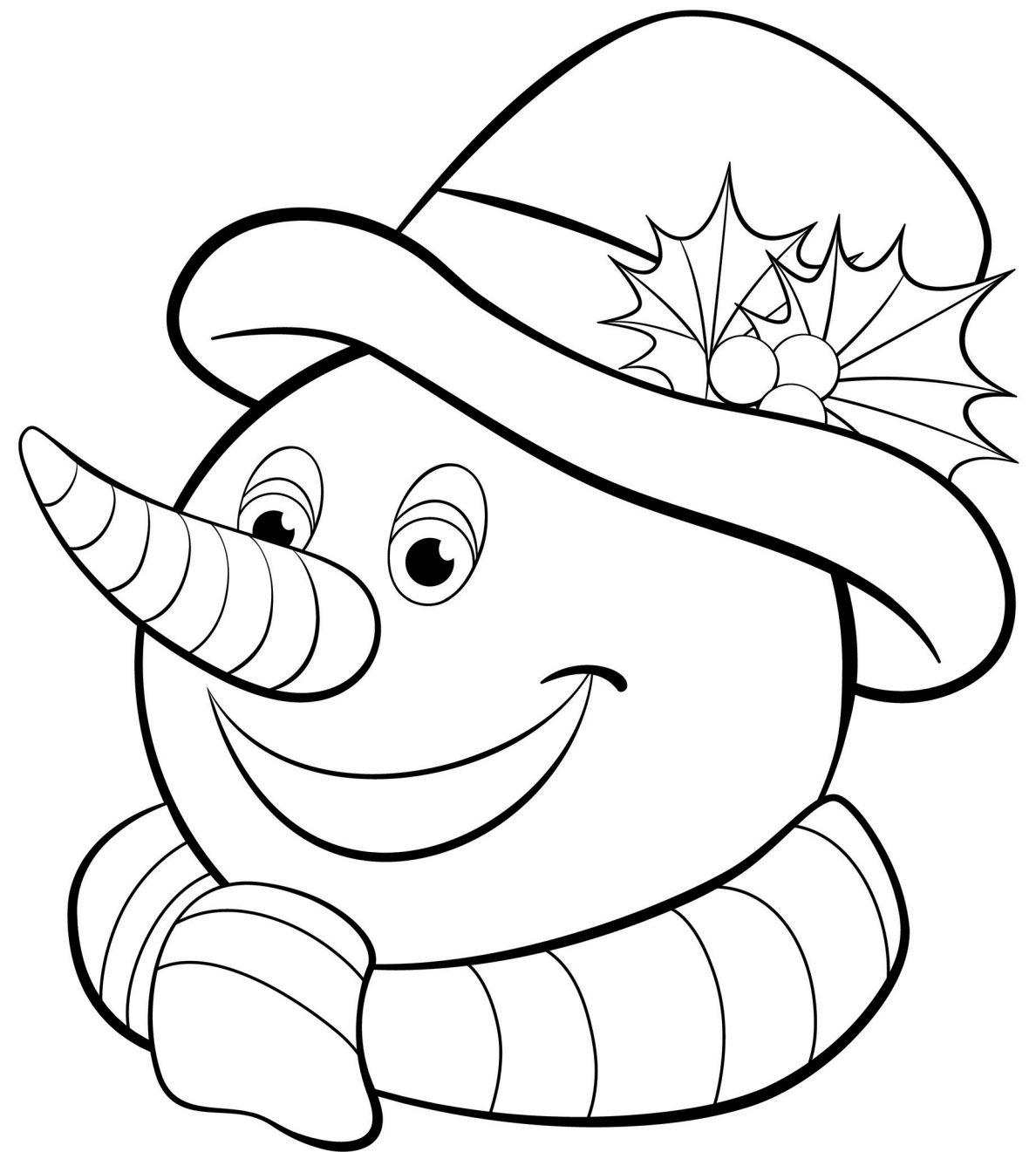

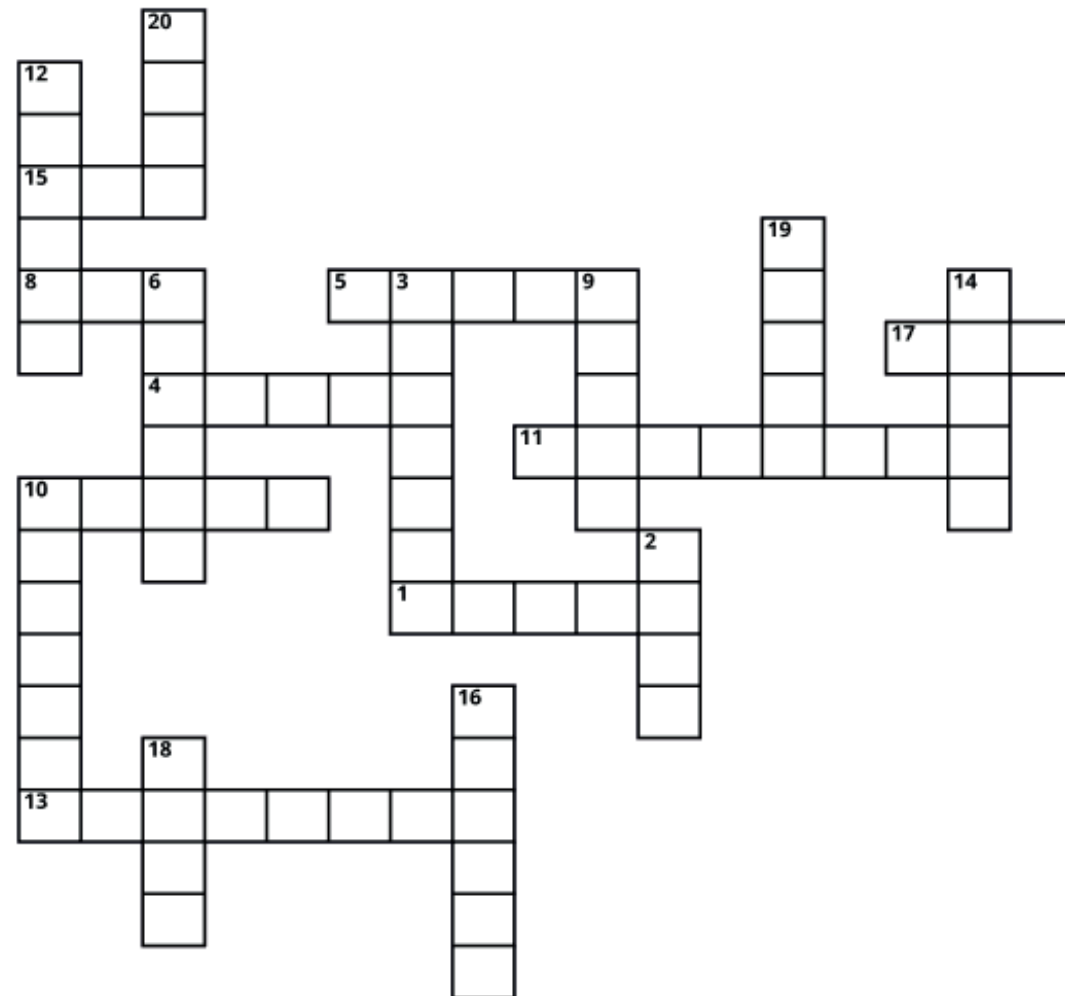

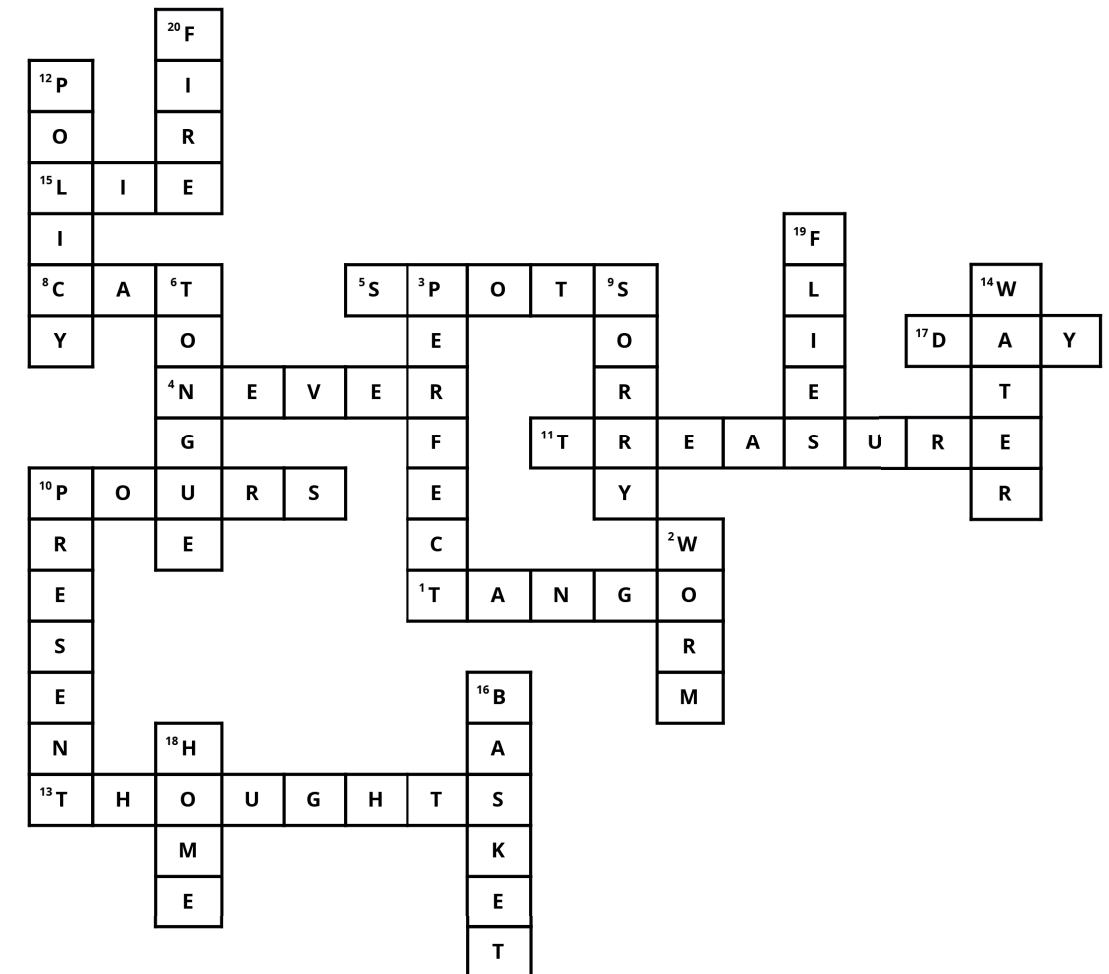

Clementine Hunter

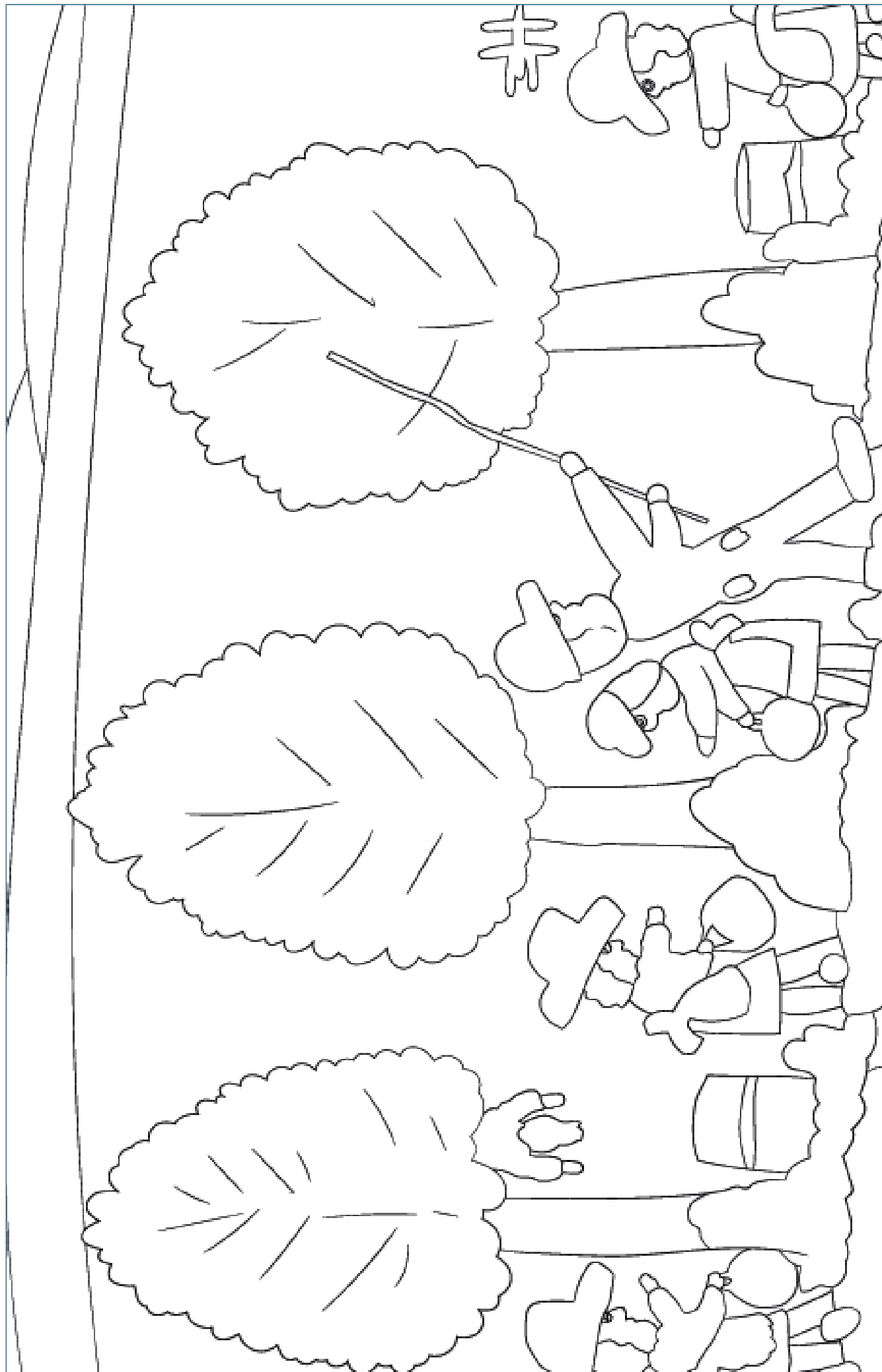

"Pecan Picking"

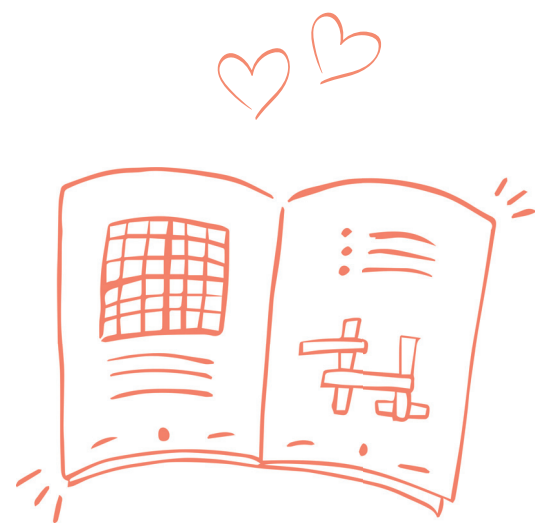

Makes the whole world seems just right.

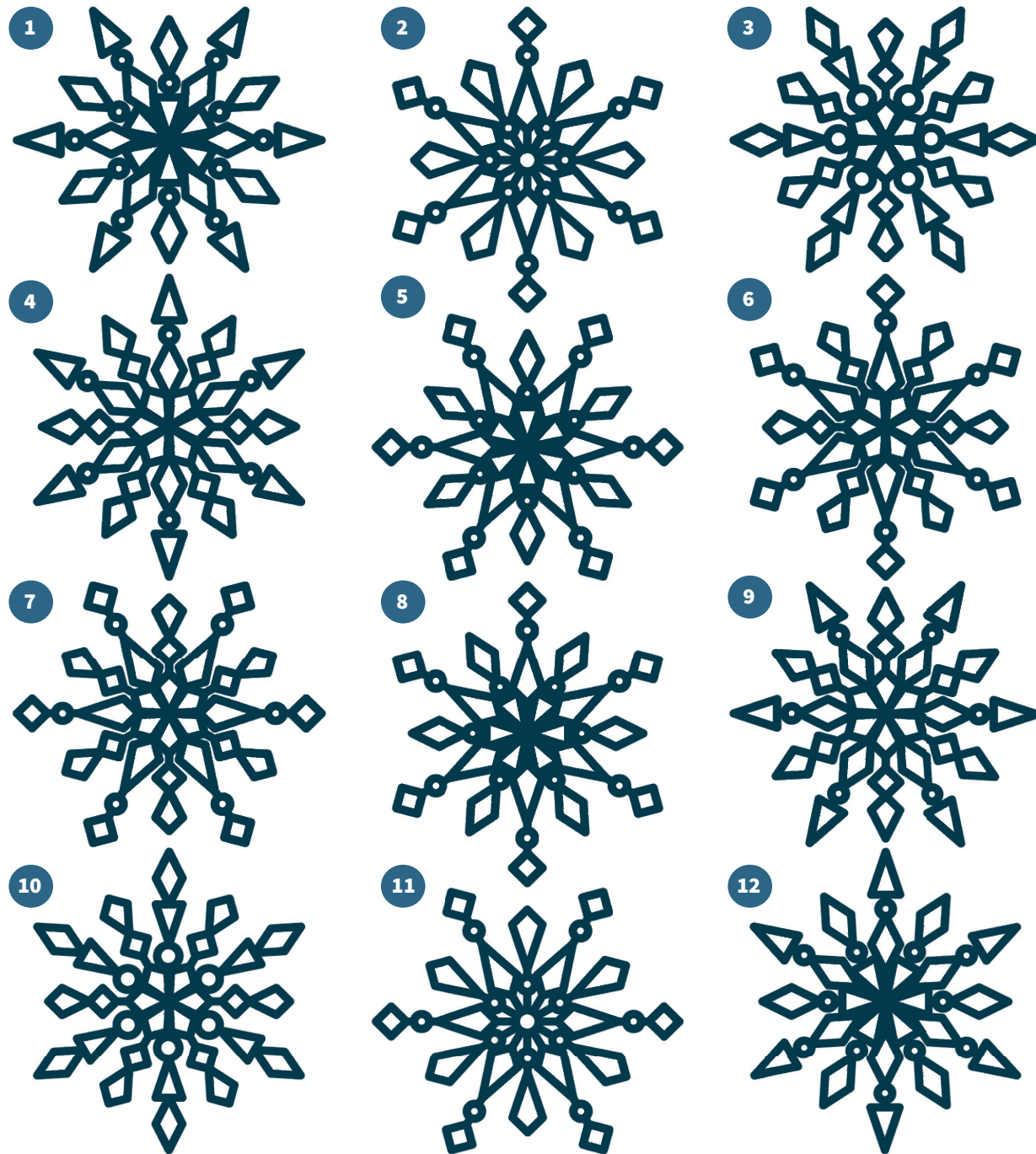
When the one whom you believe in

You'll share your whole life through.

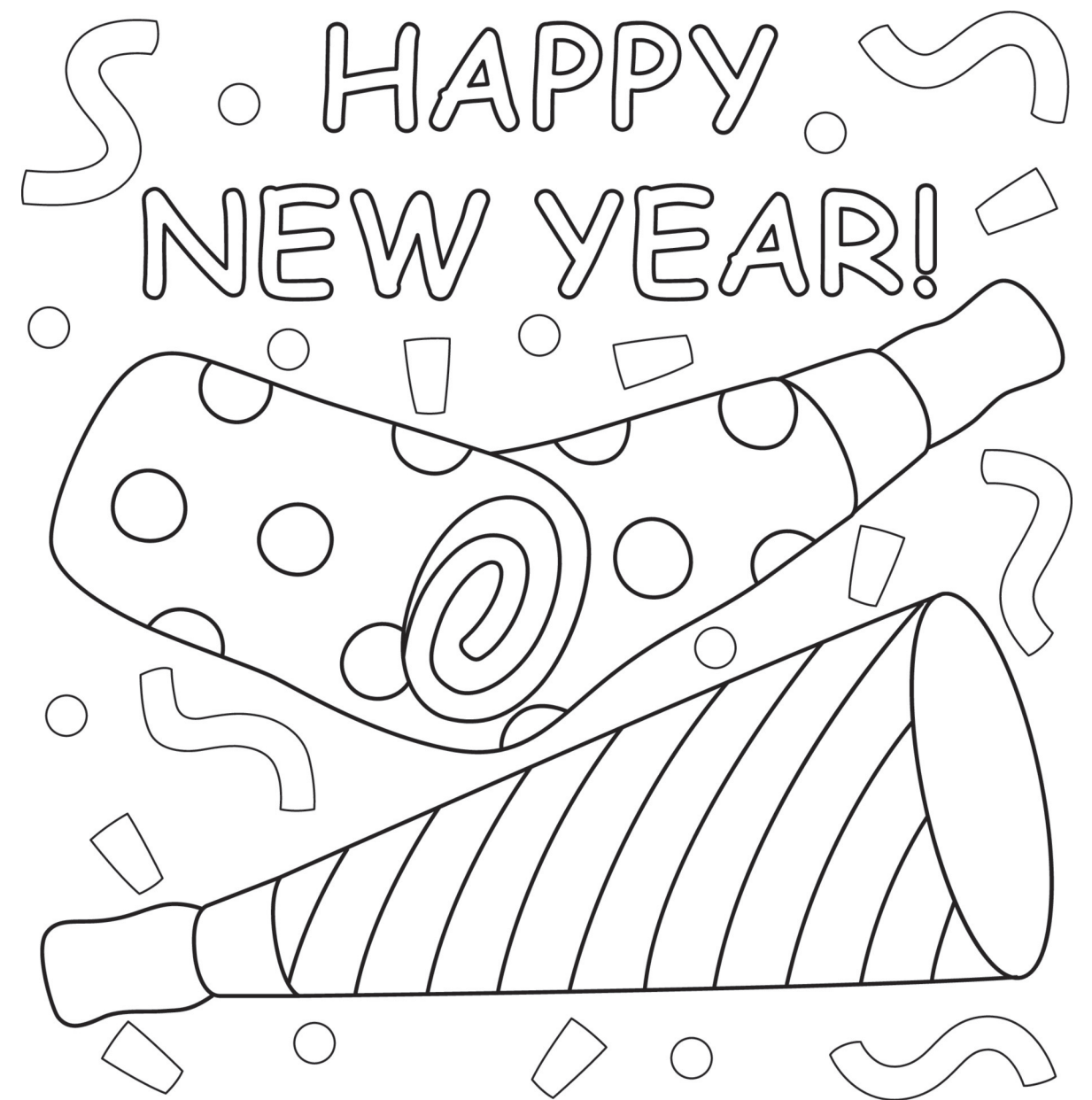

New Year Traditions From Around the World

1. **Belgium:** Farmers bless their cows on New Year and wish them a Happy New Year!
2. **Bolivia:** Coins are hidden in cakes; whoever finds them is believed to have good luck in the coming year.
3. **Brazil:** Brazilians release white flowers into the ocean for the Goddess of the Sea.
4. **Chile:** Many people visit cemeteries at midnight on New Year's Eve to pay respects to their loved ones who have passed away.
5. **China:** Chinese New Year, also known as the Spring Festival, starts on the new moon that falls between January 21 and February 20.
6. **Denmark:** The Danish smash plates on New Year Eve for good luck.
7. **Ecuador:** They burn paper-filled scarecrows at midnight, symbolizing the removal of the old and the arrival of the new.
8. **Egypt:** New Year is only celebrated once the crescent moon is sighted.
9. **Finland:** The Finns throw cast molten tin into a bucket of water and 'interpret' the result!
10. **France:** They eat piles of pancakes!
11. **Germany:** Drinking 'Bowler' (punch) watching the classic sketch 'Dinner for One', and indulging in 'Berliners' (a type of jam donut).
12. **Greece:** Onions are hung on the front doors signifying rebirth & regrowth.

13. **Italy:** People wear red underwear to be lucky in love in the New Year.
14. **Japan:** New Year Buddhist bells are rung exactly 108 times at midnight to symbolize the cleansing of sins and the start of a fresh year.
15. **Romania:** People wear real bear skins and dance through snowy streets to ward away evil spirits.
16. **Scotland:** People swing large fireballs around for the 'Hogmanay' festival.
17. **Siberia:** Trees are planted underneath frozen lakes and rivers as a symbol for starting over.
18. **South Africa:** In some parts of South Africa they throw furniture out of the window.
19. **Spain:** At the stroke of midnight, 12 grapes are eaten to ward off bad luck.
20. **Switzerland:** Ice cream is dropped on the floor.
21. **Thailand:** They throw buckets of water and gray talc at each other.
22. **Turkey:** Pomegranate seeds are thrown in the air for good luck.
23. **USA:** Kissing on New Year's Eve & singing Auld Lang Syne. (This tradition is followed in many other countries too).
