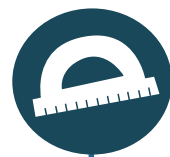
One of the cyclists with an electric bike covers the longest distance.

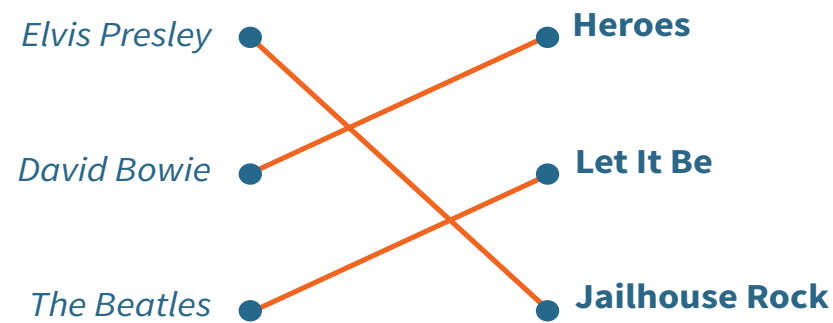

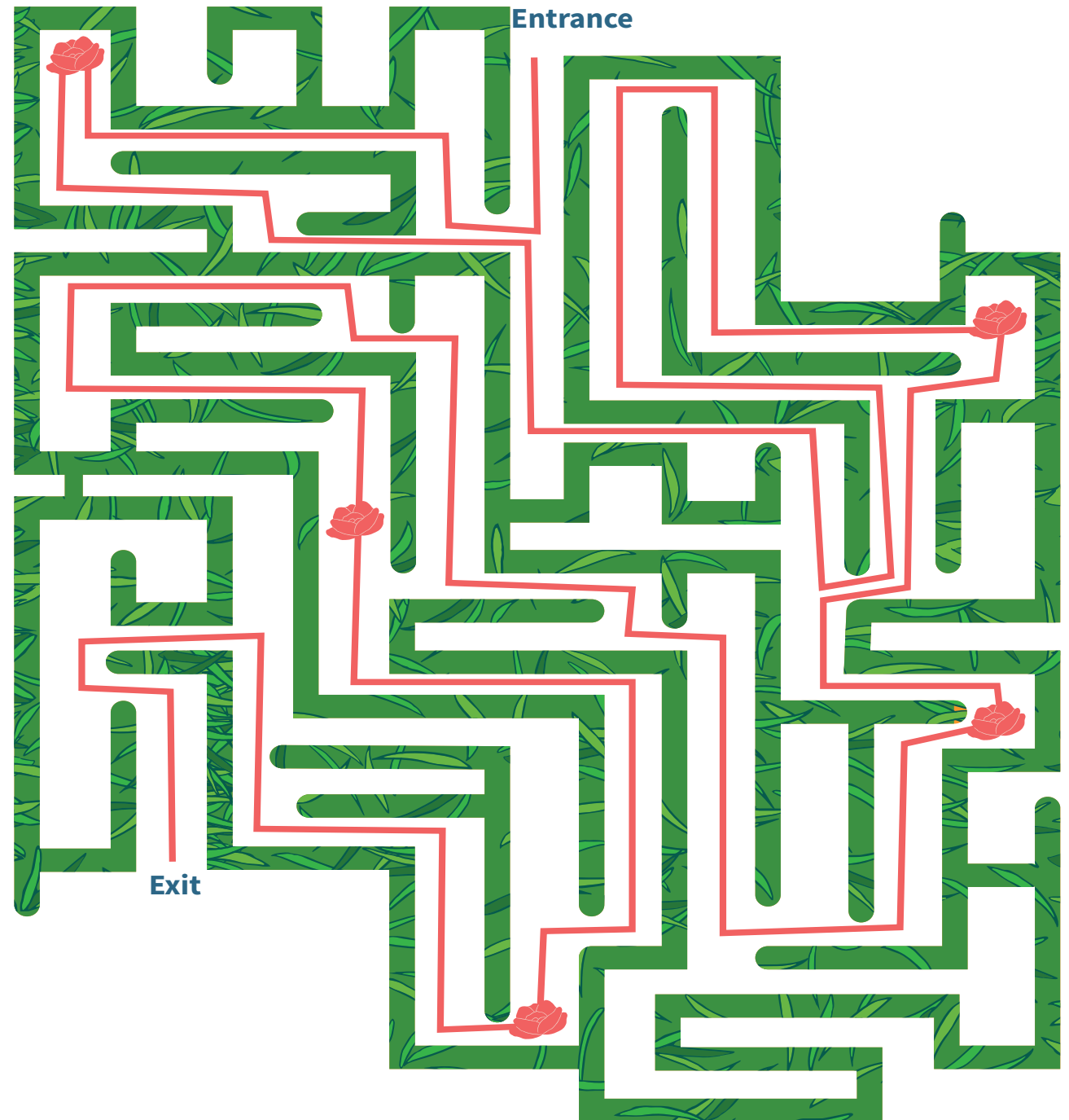

## Solution

1. The 2026 World Cup kicks off on June 11th. In which iconic stadium is the opening match played?

**B** Built in 1966, the Estadio Azteca is the only stadium in the world to have hosted three World Cups (1970, 1986 and 2026). It is where Pelé lifted the trophy in 1970 and where Maradona scored his famous 'goal of the century' in 1986.

2. On June 6th, 1944, the Allied landing in Normandy had a famous code name. What was it?

**C** On June 6, 1944, more than 150,000 Allied soldiers landed on the beaches of Normandy as part of Operation Overlord. It was the largest amphibious military operation in history, and the starting point of the liberation of Western Europe from Nazi occupation.

3. June 21st is the summer solstice. How many hours of daylight are there approximately in London on that day?

**B** On the summer solstice, the sun rises at around 4:43am and sets at around 9:21pm in London, offering approximately 16 hours of daylight. It is the longest day of the year.

4. On June 28th, 1919, which treaty officially ended World War One?»

**A** On June 28th, 1919, the Treaty of Versailles was signed, officially ending World War One. Negotiated in the Palace of Versailles in France, it marked the formal conclusion of the conflict between the Allied powers and Germany.

5. How many teams are competing in the 2026 Football World Cup, a historic first?

**C** For the first time, the World Cup expands from 32 to 48 participating nations, with a total of 104 matches spread across 16 stadiums in the United States, Canada and Mexico.
