- B** Born in Warsaw, Marie Curie is the only person ever to receive two Nobel Prizes in different fields, Physics (1903) and Chemistry (1911). Her groundbreaking work on radioactivity revolutionized both science and medicine.

1868



Before computers, the typewriter revolutionized writing! Invented in 1868 by Christopher Latham Sholes, it allowed people to type letters one by one on paper using a keyboard. Its famous "QWERTY" layout is still used on our computers today!

1876



In 1876, Alexander Graham Bell invented the very first telephone. Thanks to him, the human voice could travel through electrical wires, an incredible innovation that brought families closer together and forever changed the way we communicate.

1879



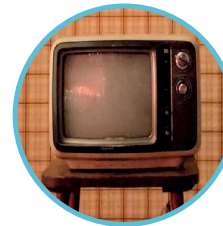
Before it, people used candles or oil lamps for light. In 1879, Thomas Edison developed an incandescent bulb that could shine for many hours. A brilliant invention that transformed daily life and brightened nights all around the world.

1913



Before it appeared, people kept food in cool cellars or with blocks of ice. The first electric refrigerator, invented in 1913, made food storage much easier and safer. An essential invention that changed the way we cook and live.

1926



In 1926, Scottish engineer John Logie Baird presented the first television demonstration. For the first time, moving images were transmitted over a distance! Since then, television has become a familiar companion a witness to history and everyday life in millions of homes.
